As the Producing Artistic Director, duties included:

- Regular communication with the Dean of the College of Visual and Performing Arts to collaboratively cultivate this new professional venture.
- Hiring, supervising, and evaluating all creative and production staff. Including the hiring of professional regional directors in an effort to expand our student's networks.
- Casting all productions with a combination of UNCG students, UNCG alumni, and members of the Broadway community.
- Negotiating with Actors Equity Association in order to secure Guest Artist contracts for performers and stage managers.
- Overseeing all aspects of production and developing and maintaining an annual budget.
- Reconciling Box Office accounts for income and attendance records.
- Securing corporate sponsorships and cultivating relationships for future unearned income.
- Collaborating with media and publications for all press releases and print/digital advertisements and announcements.
- Implementing and overseeing the artistic vision and focus of the program.

In 2010, BIG ARTS acquired the theatre formerly known as the Pirate Playhouse and then the Herb Strauss Theatre. As the Artistic Director and senior creative employee responsible for the merging of these two formerly separate organizations, duties included:
